## SWCC Permit Secretary's Report

Annual permit holding clubs can now book keys via the Digital Destination Board app 24/7.

If you would like to use this feature in DDB, please download the app and create an account, then send me your DDB username, name and club.

Permit Secretary to liaise with SWCC Secretary and SWCC comms to enable this to happen.

1. The adoption of the Digital Destination Board application continues to be significant throughout 2025. One issue was found with the application during a recent Android update. The issue was fixed in 1 week by Josh Vaughan.
2. One major access issue was noted during the period involving University of Bristol Speleological Society.
3. Completion of all fields of the key log sheet have improved but all SWCC members and permit holders should be notified to improve their completion of the log sheet. The footfall data provided for conservation purposes relies on the key log sheet being completed correctly. This point is already stressed in bold text to all permit applicants via email. Suggestions to improve the data quality in the key log sheet are welcomed.
4. I have started to write an SOP (Standard Operating Procedure) for the SWCC Permit Secretary role. This document will serve to standardise the role and provide instruction to the next permit secretary.
5. The criteria to be eligible for applying for an annual permit is unclear. I believe the criteria needs clarification in writing on the OFD access and entry procedure document. Currently the criteria mentioned is:

“The Permit Secretary shall, on behalf of SWCC, have absolute discretion in interpreting these conditions and may refuse a permit, in which case the applicant and SWCC Committee will be informed of the reason for refusal. The applicant may appeal in writing to the Committee of SWCC at 1-10, Powell Street, Penwyllt, Pen-y-Cae, Swansea, SA9 1GQ. Annual Permits may be issued to clubs that have demonstrated a regular and conscientious interest in OFD.

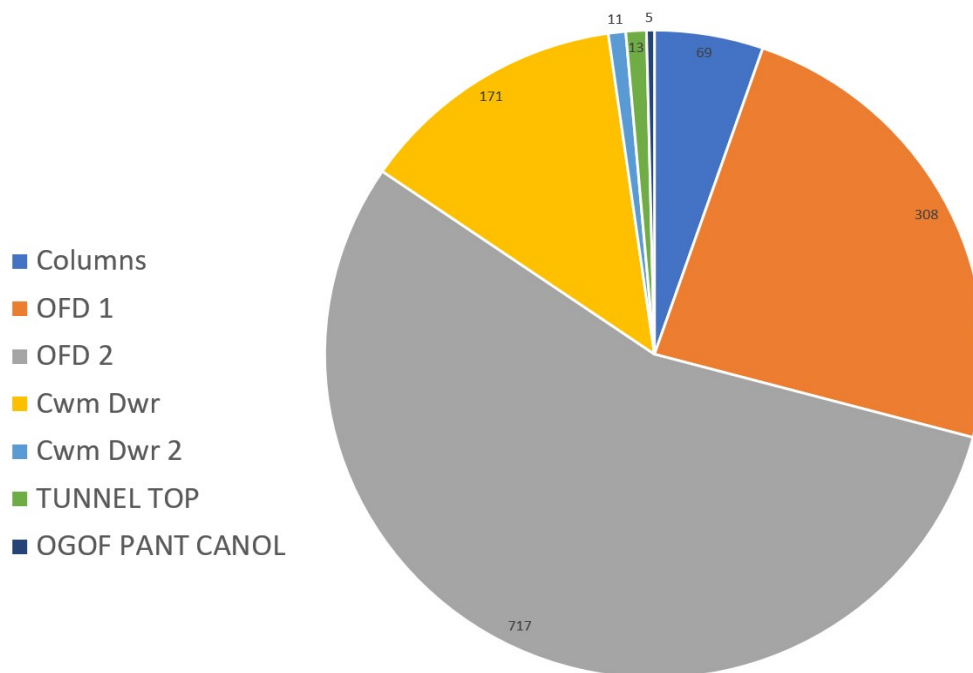
Applications for Annual Permits should be made to The Permit Secretary. Each Annual Permit holding club shall be notified of these Access Procedures. All Leaders, be they permitted by Date Specific Permit or Annual Permit are assumed to have read accepted and understood these guidelines and Access Procedures.”

I propose a number of trips or permits over a number of years be specified to clarify the criteria to caving clubs. University of Leeds Speleo Association have requested an annual permit for example and they have completed 14 trips under 10 permits over 4 dates in the last 3 years.

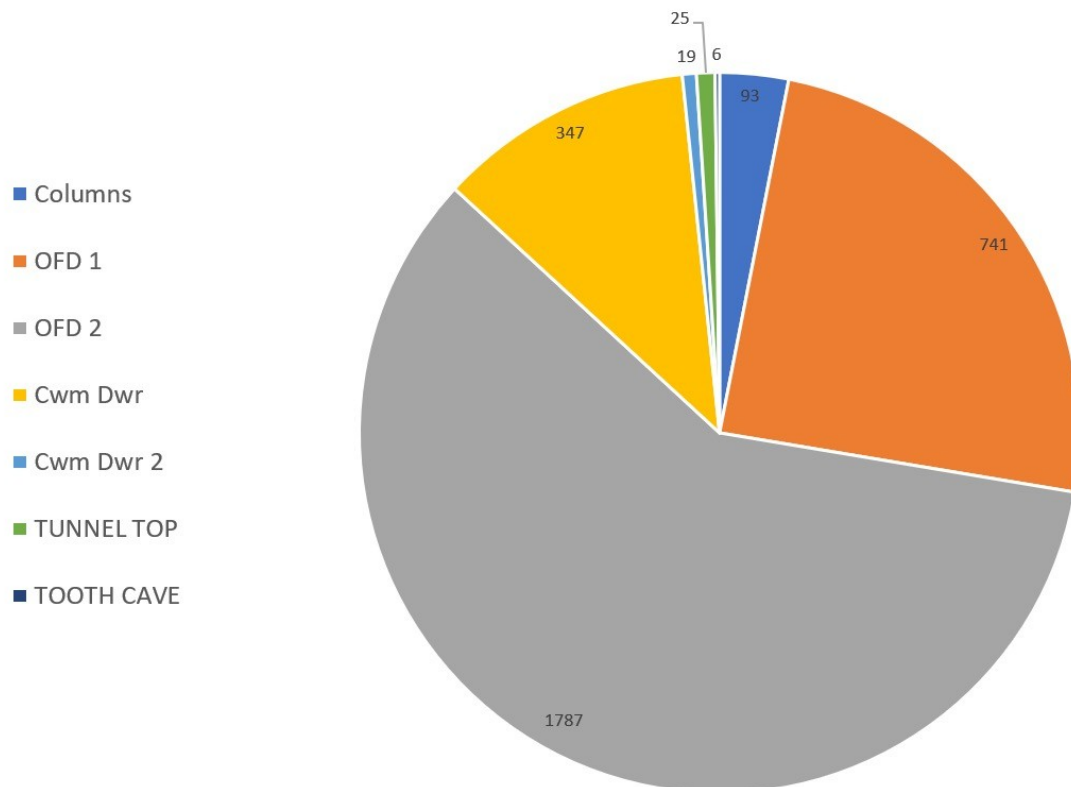

## Fixed Aids Officers Report

Fixed Aids work and regular inspections are ongoing.

There has only been one resin anchor installation since the last OFDCAG meeting: four resin anchors at the Letterbox. The chain is due to be replaced with stainless chain from two anchors in due course. Chain, maillons, rings and a new Divers' pitch rope have been purchased and funded by Caving Wales/Ogofa Cymru.

The worn rope on the Divers' pitch has been replaced with the new rope, which can be reversed if it becomes worn at the top end. Chain has been used at the very top to avoid wear of the rope on various rub points.

The bolts on the Fault Aven pull-up are still due for resin anchor installation to replace the old non-stainless anchors. The anchors will then be fitted with stainless chain and rings for the pull-up system. Once this is complete, all recorded rope anchors associated with SWCC Official Fixed Aids will be modern stainless anchors. Some non-stainless anchors may remain e.g. on the Maypole ladder.

The Skyhook (which is not an official SWCC Fixed Aid) will also be fitted with chain and rings and returned to being a pull-up system.

I have circulated two proposals for resin anchor installations around the Fixed Aids Advisory Group and received no objections. I would like to propose that the OFDCAG recommends these locations for resin anchor installation.

### Proposal 1: Mutiny Junction pitch (p11)

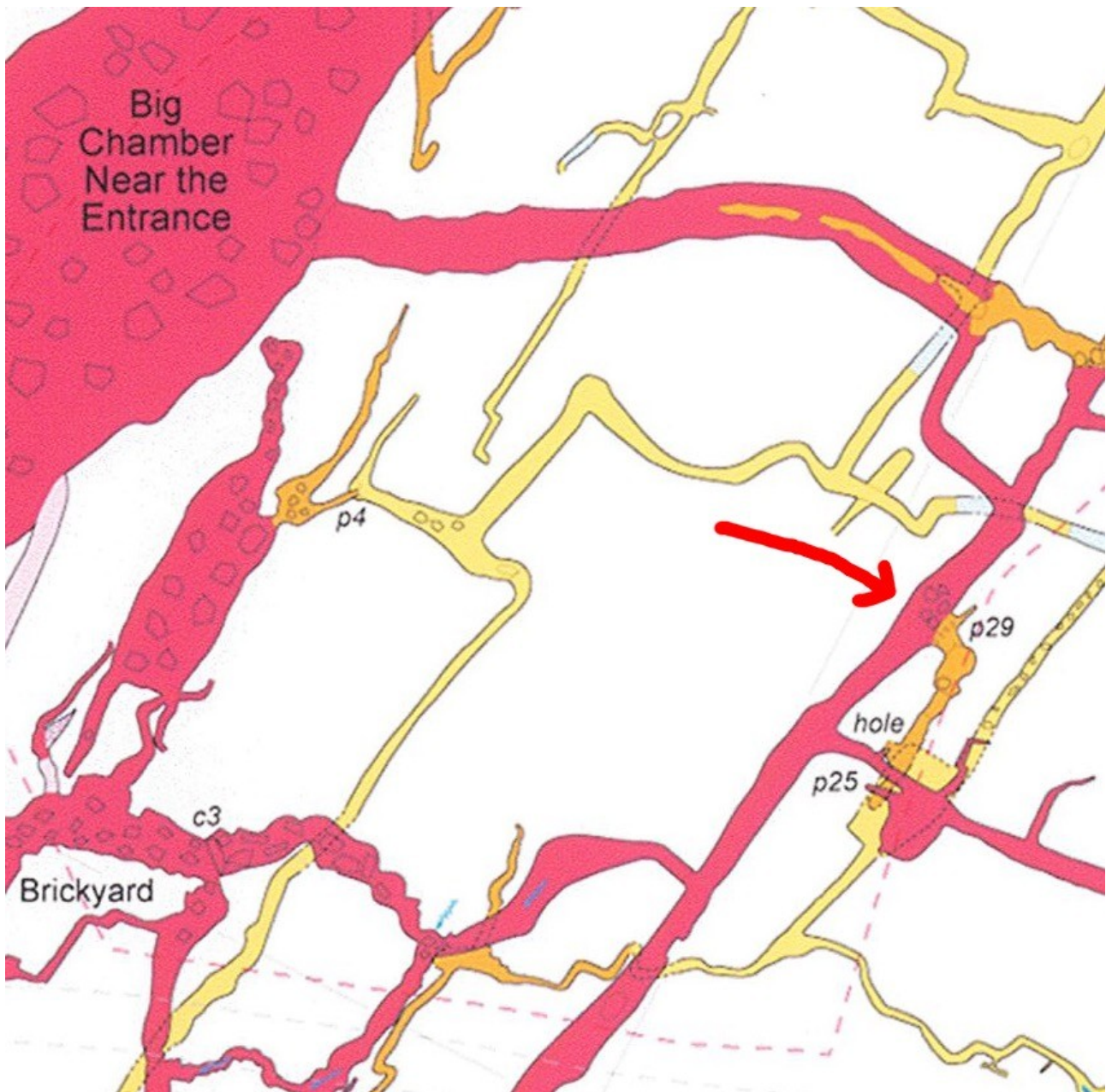
This pitch is an 'up' pitch (indicated on the survey below with a red arrow). It gets less traffic than some other pitches due to its relatively more distant location, but it forms part of a round trip via the Skyhook and the p6, p5 and p11 also shown on the survey below. Currently the route has a mixture of anchor types and is broken into a few short pitches via ledges, but the top of the last rope is on a ledge where a further approximately 6m exposed and loose chimney climb is required. Most of the rock at the top of this chimney climb is shattered and there are no natural anchors, making belaying tricky. The total height of the pitch and climb is probably closer to 20m than 11m.

I believe a new resin anchor route could bypass this chimney by traversing over a chockstone at the head of what would become the pitch, placing anchors in the solid roof of the passage, and allowing a clean drop down where the route would join the current one (with new resin anchors as required). Maintaining this route is important as it is one of two ways into Merthyr Vale, the other being the p6, p5 and p11 mentioned earlier (also currently on fixed ropes) but this route is tight and awkward and not suitable for larger cavers.



### Proposal 2: Labyrinth Pitch (p29)

This pitch currently has spits. It is occasionally used for SRT, and is conveniently close to the entrance. I looked at this pitch (from above) recently and it has spits in a tricky position high on the wall for the first pitch, descending to a wide ledge around 8m down, where a Y-hang from in-situ hangers descends further via a deviation on the second pitch. I have been told that these anchors are now in a poor state, and furthermore with the current rigging there is also the risk of landing on the wrong side of the conservation tape. A new resin anchor could take a more straightforward descent of the first pitch, probably starting with a pair of anchors on the wall leading down a traverse to a Y-hang over the first pitch and then another Y-hang over the second pitch with an anchored (and likely in-situ) deviation to ensure cavers land on the correct side of the conservation tape.



Andrew spoke to support the proposals, highlighting that both of them had safety implications.

Luke reported that all Annual Permit holders were being informed that illicit bolting was not allowed and would result in the refusal of permits.

## Rescue Liason Report

We are looking at alternatives to this pitch because it has some issues near the top that make stretcher handling difficult as exemplified in George's rescue but I'll update on this when we have some defined ideas.
